Why Join Band?

Participation in band goes far beyond learning an instrument—it helps students develop critical thinking, problem-solving, and teamwork skills that benefit them in **all** areas of life. Studies show that students involved in music education achieve **higher test scores, graduation rates, college acceptance rates, and even future earnings!** Band students build strong friendships, improve communication skills, and gain confidence that lasts a lifetime. Most 5th grade students try band!

The Pipestone Promise Band Scholarship

We are committed to ensuring that music education benefits every student. Through the **Pipestone Promise Band Scholarship**, all students who participate in band from **grades 5–12** will receive a **guaranteed \$1,000 scholarship** for college or trade school!

What to Expect in 5th Grade Band

- **Band takes place during the school day** – no extra time commitment required!
- **Only three evening concerts** per year to showcase students' progress.
- **A summer start-up week** before school begins to help students get comfortable with their instruments and learn their first notes.
- **Future opportunities** to participate in honor bands, jazz band, marching band, drumline, and travel around the region and country as students advance in the band program.
- **Instrument options:** We recommend a rent-to-own program to ensure access to a high-quality instrument. However, **the school has instruments available for loan at no cost** so that every student can participate!

Why Start in 5th Grade?


While band is optional in 5th grade, students must take **band, choir, or both** in middle school. Trying band in 5th grade gives them a **head start** and allows them to explore music in a fun, low-pressure environment.

Frequently Asked Questions

Is Band a Regular Class?

Yes. The 5th-grade band meets during the school day for 30 minutes. Students will receive a letter grade in band just as they do in their other academic classes.

Are there After School Practices?

No. The only required band activities outside of the school day are concerts. The 5th graders usually perform three concerts a year, in December, March, and May.

How Much Practice is Required?

Beginners should practice a few times a week for approximately 15 minutes a day.

Should My Child Already Know How to Read Music?

No. Your child will be taught how to read notes and rhythms in band. Our first few weeks of lessons will focus on learning to read music and how it applies to playing their instrument of choice. You will be amazed at how quickly your child progresses!

Which Instrument Should My Child Choose?

Woodwinds (flute, clarinet, and alto saxophone are usually rented from the music store, and oboe and bassoon are typically loaned through the school.)

Flute – a popular choice, can be challenging to make a sound at first, similar to blowing air into a pop bottle.

Oboe – small instrument, the double reed used can present difficulties. This instrument is for students who are looking for a challenge.

Bassoon – a larger instrument, the double reed used can present difficulties. This instrument is for students who are looking for a challenge.

Clarinet – very successful beginning instrument, starts more straightforward but does get more challenging with added fingerings. Clarinets use reeds which can be purchased through the school.

Alto Saxophone – it can be challenging to get a good sound at first; after playing for one to two years, switching to tenor saxophone may be an option. Saxophone also uses reeds, which may be purchased through the school.

Brass (trumpets and trombones are rented from the music store; horn, baritone, and tuba are loaned from the school.)

Trumpet – small mouthpiece suitable for smaller lips; valves change notes.

Trombone – bigger mouthpiece, suitable for those with full lips; notes are used using a slide instead of valves. (The school does have some trombones that can be rented.)

Horn – small mouthpiece, suitable for those with smaller lips; notes are changed by using valves, which are difficult to begin learning at first.

Baritone – a very successful beginning instrument with a bigger mouthpiece similar in size to the trombone, and notes are played using valves.

Tuba – large mouthpiece, larger than the baritone; notes are played using valves. The size of this instrument can be a challenge for some students.

*Percussion (Students purchase a home practice kit. Students will use the school percussion during class. To participate in percussion a student must either already have some experience playing piano **or** be recommended by the elementary music teacher.)*

Percussion consists of learning stick and mallet percussion. All percussion students will learn snare drum, bass drum, timpani, marimba, xylophone, and bells.

How Do We Get an Instrument?

The easiest way to help your child get started is to rent an instrument from a music store. **We encourage our students to rent from Music Street in Marshall, MN.** They provide excellent service and have quality instruments. They also visit the school once a week during the school year to repair instruments. By renting, you can have a smaller investment in the beginning, plus their program is rent-to-own, so by 8th grade, the instrument is usually paid for. We want every student to have access to participating in band. **If renting an instrument presents a financial hardship, you can request a school instrument.**

Are There Other Fees?

Students who play clarinet, saxophone, oboe, or bassoon will receive one set of reeds. After that, they will need to purchase their own box. (Usually around 25 dollars.)

Do You Offer Beginning Band Over the Summer

Yes, there is a week of beginning band lessons in August. These sessions are optional but encouraged because they help give students individual attention while learning the basics of playing. More information on this will be sent out in July to families.

What If I'm Not Sure? Can I Join Once School Starts?

Yes, this is possible. However, please realize that starting later may set you back a bit from the other students who have been playing already. Remember that you will have to practice extra to get caught up.

Can My Child Be in Sports and Do Band?

Yes. The goal for all of our students is to raise well-rounded children that will grow up to be leaders in our community and world. This is achieved by encouraging students to participate in various activities offered through our school and community. In a town, the size of Pipestone, sports and music must co-exist and “share” students. As a music department, we work very hard to make our schedules “work” together with other activities for your child’s benefit. The good news is that there are very FEW scheduling conflicts throughout middle school.

Music Street offers a simple, affordable rent-to-own program for band instruments. For your student to be most successful, they need a quality instrument that's easy-to-play, durable, and reliable. A benefit of renting from Music Street is that they visit the school once a week to repair instruments and make deliveries.

Band Instruments

\$35/month (includes tax & \$3 fee) - Flute, Clarinet, Trumpet, Trombone, Percussion

\$50/month (includes tax & \$3 fee) - Alto Sax, Baritone, Xylophone

\$65/month (includes tax & \$3 fee) - Tenor Sax, French Horn, Euphonium

- Trade instrument during first 4 months at no extra charge
- Pay in full and receive a 10% discount on unpaid balance
- Weekly service calls to area schools
- New or reconditioned instruments available

Importance of a quality instrument

For a student to be able to succeed, they need an instrument that will allow them to succeed. Cheap internet specials may look nice, but will be difficult to play, won't sound good, and will be difficult (or oftentimes impossible) to service when inevitable repairs need to be done. A quality instrument is an investment into giving your student the foundation to succeed!

Come try all the instruments and figure out which one is right for you!
